NYS Adopted Uniformed Voting Date

- NYS District Budget Vote is held annually on the 3rd Tuesday in May
- NYS School District Budget Requirement of Public Hearing
 - Provides the community with an additional opportunity to learn about the District upcoming budget that will be Voted on May 16th



Budget Process

- Ongoing process that requires the input from faculty, staff, and administration before being brough to the Board.
- Working with key District personnel and stakeholders to identify educational needs for the District for the upcoming School Year
- In February we review our rollover budget with the BOE
- Internally we review with each department to discuss programs, personnel, and recurring projections
 - With preliminary data we can develop our proposed spending plan that meets the identified needs while being fiscally responsible



Budget Process

- We presented Non- Instructional Budget and Instructional Budget in early March
- Projected revenues were presented in late March
- Final Budget was presented to the BOE at the April BOE meeting and formally adopted at the same meeting
- In total there has been 5 public presentations made to the Board on the 2023-2024 proposed Budget

Provide a Safe, Inclusive, Welcoming Environment for All

Continue to implement the NY State Standards, District and School Safety Plans, Codes of Conduct, and the Dignity for All Students Act.
