NYS Adopted Uniformed Voting Date

- NYS District Budget Vote is held annually on the 3rd Tuesday in May
- NYS School District Budget Requirement of Public Hearing
 - Provides the community with an additional opportunity to learn about the District upcoming budget that will be Voted on May 21st

Budget Process

- Ongoing process that requires the input from faculty, staff, and administration before being brought to the Board.
- Working with key District personnel and stakeholders to identify educational needs for the District for the upcoming School Year
- In January we review our rollover budget with the BOE
- Internally we review with each department to discuss programs, personnel, and recurring projections
 - With preliminary data we can develop our proposed spending plan that meets the identified needs while being fiscally responsible

Budget Presentations

- Rollover Budget Presented in January
- Non- Instructional Budget in February & Instructional Budget in early March
- Projected revenues were presented in late March along with BOE Budget workshop
- Final Budget was presented at both April BOE meetings and formally adopted at the April 17th meeting
- In total there has been 6 public presentations made to the Board on the 2024-2025 proposed Budget

Budget Goal #1

Provide a Safe, Inclusive, Welcoming Environment for All

Continue to implement the NY State Standards, District and School Safety Plans, Codes of Conduct, and the Dignity for All Students Act. By doing this, we will create a safe, welcoming, and inclusive environment that affirms the richness of all students, and empowers students as agents of the school community, while reducing barriers to full participation in district activities.

Measurement of Effectiveness:

- Attendance improvement of students and staff
- More participation in extra-curricular activities
- Continued implementation of the Positivity Project and Restorative Practice

This curriculum will engage students to think analytically and creatively in the areas of literacy, numeracy, and STEAM so that they are prepared for college, career, and global citizenship.

WHAT IS A CONTINGENT BUDGET?

- Under NYS Law, if voters reject a School District's budget twice- the district is required to operate under a contingent budget
- Note! The BOE may choose to immediately adopt a contingent budget after the first budget vote is defeated OR hold a second budget vote
- If the Board decides to have a second vote, they may choose to submit the same budget or present a modified budget with cuts
 - Only Ordinary Contingent Expenditures are permitted if a budget is defeated by voters

Note!

The Board of Education is permitted to determine what constitutes ordinary contingent expenses with limitations

ADDITIONAL LIMITATIONS OF A CONTINGENT BUDGET

TAX LEVY LIMITATION

The tax levy under a contingent budget cannot exceed the prior year's levy.

ADMINISTRATIVE CAP LIMITATION

Administrative cap cannot be GREATER than the prior year's or the defeated budget Administrative cap

- Non-contingent expenditures generally must be removed from a contingent budget EXAMPLES OF NON-CONTINGENT EXPENDITURES
- Equipment purchases and new capital projects not related to the health and safety of students and staff are prohibited
- Use of school buildings and grounds by outside organizations

(except where there is no identifiable added cost)

WHAT ARE ORDINARY CONTINGENT EXPENSES?

- Ordinary Contingent Expenses are expenditures necessary to provide the minimum services legally required to:
 - Operate and maintain school buildings and educational programs
 - Preserve the property of the District and Ensure the health and safety of students and staff
 - Legal Expenses including:

Debt Service - Interest and principal on District borrowings

Judgements-Court orders and orders of the Commissioner of Education

Other legal obligations including social security, payroll taxes and garnishments

Pre-existing contractual obligations

OTHER EXPENSES PERMITTED UNDER CONTINGENT BUDGET

- Note! Teachers, Administrators, Superintendent and other positions requiring SED certification, District Clerk, District Treasurer and Internal Claims Auditor may receive salary increases under a contingent budget
- Non-instructional salary increases-including, clerical, custodial, maintenance personnel are permitted under a contingent budget
